IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR GOAT EXHIBITORS : PROCEDURE FOR MOVEMENT OF NORTHERN IRELAND GOATS INTO AND OUT OF THE SHOW

IDENTIFICATION - For Moves to and from a Show

All goats irrespective of their date of birth, must be identified with two identifiers bearing the same number.

MOVEMENT - GOATS GOING TO A SHOW

- Movement of goats to Shows must be accompanied by a fully and accurately completed SG2 self-written movement document.
- The individual identification numbers should be recorded on the SG2 document (it is acceptable to attach a printed schedule listing the tag numbers to the SG2). These numbers should be checked by the Show Operators against the animals presented before the animals are allowed entry to the Show.
- The SG2 movement document authorises the movement of sheep or goats from the farm to Show premises. The SG2 movement documents must be stamped by the Show Secretary. The white copy should be sent to the local DARD Direct/Divisional Veterinary Office within 7 days.
- Show Operators should have one book of movement documents (SG2s) for goats and a separate one for sheep.

MOVEMENT - GOATS GOING FROM A SHOW

- The yellow copy of the SG2 provided by the Show Operator should accompany the animals back from the Show. This should include details of the Show and receiving herd, the individual tag numbers (manually added or scanned list) or be cross referenced/stapled to the pink copy of the incoming SG2 (only if the whole batch moves out at the same time). Section 3 of the outgoing SG2 should be signed by the herd keeper.
- Both move in and move out white copies of the SG2 should be sent to the Show's local DARD Direct/Divisional Veterinary Office by the Show Operator within 7 days.

PROCEDURE FOR MOVEMENT OF GOATS FROM THE REPUBLIC OF IRELAND (ROI) INTO AND OUT OF SHOWS

Goats must have two matching identifiers, one of which must carry an EID device.

NB - In order to receive goats from the ROI, the Show premises must be operating to full EU Assembly Centre Standards for goats and be approved for this purpose.

As part of these requirements ROI goats must be kept segregated from NI goats and must be re-exported directly from the show premises to their premises of origin in the ROI as soon as the show ends.

Goats Imported Directly into a Show

Goats entering a Show will be accompanied with a Health Certificate which should be copied to the local DARD Office responsible for the show. An SG2 document should be completed for the move from the ROI to the show (Show's own SG2 book).

Goats Re-Exported Directly from a Show.

Goats being re-exported to ROI will need to be accompanied by:

- Their original Health Certification suitably endorsed by the Veterinarian responsible for the Show.
- Non Co-Minglement Certificate which will be issued by the Veterinarian responsible for the Show.
- An SG2 document which should be completed for the move from the Show to the ROI (Show's own SG2 book).

IMPORTANT!

All Cattle, Sheep and Goats must be kept in the areas immediately adjacent to the area in which they are competing and out of the way of the public. No Cattle, Sheep or Goats are to be led amongst the public. No Cattle, Sheep or Goats to be led by children under the age of 8. IT IS A CONDITION OF ENTRY TO THE LISBURN & SAINTFIELD DISTRICT SHOW THAT THE OWNERS AND KEEPERS OF ALL CATTLE, SHEEP & GOATS HAVE A POLICY OF INSURANCE IN EFFECT TO COVER PUBLIC LIABILITY RISKS.

- Class No.** G1 Female Goat, any age, in milk, entered in the Seanen and British Seanen Sections of the BGS Herd Book.
- G2 Female Goat, any age, in milk, entered in the Toggenberg, British Toggenberg or British Alpine Sections of the BGS Herd Book.
- G3 Female Goat, any age, in milk, any other variety, registered in the BGS Herd Book.
- G4 Goatling that has not borne a Kid, over 1 year and under 2 years, registered as T.BT, BA or BS.
- G5 Goatling that has not borne a kid, over 1 year and under 2 years, any other variety, registered in the BGS Herd Book.
- G6 Female Kid, over 2 months and under 1 year entered in the T.BT, BA, S or BS sections of the BGS Herd Book.
- G7 Female Kid, any other variety, registered in the BGS Herd Book.
- G8 Non Pedigree Goat in milk.
- G9 Non Pedigree Female Kid or Goatling.
- G10 Group of 3 Goats, property of one exhibitor, to include one goat from classes G1 – G7.
